
### Q36 - How many Continuing Education Units (CEUs) have you earned annually since


### Q49 - How satisfied are you with your overall preparation in the area of counseling?


I received no formal education on social justice/social justice counseling and related competencies. Exposure came from informal conversation with a faculty member who was a person of color and no longer there.

Support/accountability during dissertation could be improved


All these areas are very well attended to.

### Q54 - How satisfied are you with your overall preparation in the area of supervision?







All of these areas need improvement. The program did not address them specifically, it was very general and superficial.







The program did not prepare me at all for teaching. I would select no areas of strength, and all areas for improvement, but the survey did not allow me to. I chose random answers.







The Comprehensive exam has one question for each topic (Theory, Diagnosis and Tx, Research Methods, and Ethics) yet Dx and Tx are not integrated throughout the program. Aside from research methods, none of the critical COMP topics are covered extensively and all should be integrated throughout the program so they are learned and absorbed not just memorized.

Writing for grant proposals and finding funding skills

I was lucky that I found a mentor who was very supportive of me, but this seemed like a rarity. Talking with other people in CE programs, there is a lot of collaboration between faculty and doctoral students, and the faculty see the doctoral students as future peers. There was not this sense of connection or collaboration at GW.

The clinical supervision training and clinical skills training surpasses most PsyD models of education in my opinion. This program has a very strong theoretical and research-driven base which provides and intentional foundation for clinical work

I truly appreciated the mentoring from faculty and the opportunity to gain deep experience in supervision.

Being forced to participate in the GW clinic to provide free supervision to the master's students was not related to my professional goals, not helpful as a model of learning how to supervise, and made the logistics of supporting myself financially through the program rather difficult. But I believe this is already different now.
