THE PRAXIS Exams

The PRAXIS exams are meant to measure subject-specific content knowledge in preparation for licensure. The tests are required for graduation from the university.

Frequently Asked Questions

When do I have to take the exams?

How do I register for an exam?

How do I study for a Praxis exam?

What score do I have to receive in order to pass each exam?

You do not have to pass the exams in order to graduate, but if you want to use the exams for an endorsement on your license, each state has a specific score requirement: [State Score Requirements](#). You can also find state licensure office contact information attached to your official program plan.

How do I submit my exam scores?

All scores must be submitted directly to the George Washington University using the code: RA5246

Is there any financial aid to help pay for the exams?

NOTE: Some exams are only offered during very specific time windows. Please be sure to research in advance to find out when each exam is being offered.
